

J-SOC: the evidence in brief

How Israel's Diaspora Ministry tracks protests abroad. Research brief.

What we found

In the 70 J-SOC reports we collected, Israel's Diaspora Ministry lists 2,259 planned protests and events in 57 countries between December 2024 and October 2026. The United Kingdom (265), the United States (249), Italy (184) and Australia (171) appear most. Every listing carries the Ministry's risk rating: 1,180 low, 942 medium, 134 high and 2 extreme.

What a listing contains

Detailed entries give the place and time, the groups behind the event and their social-media following, and often the distance to the nearest Israeli site. Every listing on our site links to the Ministry's original report on gov.il. We checked 100 at random against the originals and found one transcription error.

How to read this

The codes after each section (S55 and so on) match the full report and the downloadable source list. A listing is a forecast, not a confirmed protest, and the same event can appear in more than one report. We withhold the names of private individuals; organisations and public figures are shown.

Inside the command post

What the Ministry said it would do, and one of its actual reports.

What it was set up to do

The Ministry announced the centre on 18 August 2024. It would build a shared picture of online activity for government and civil-society bodies, starting in English, French, Arabic and Hebrew across TikTok, YouTube, Facebook, Telegram and X. The Ministry said this would support political, legal, educational and cognitive work. That was the plan as announced. It doesn't tell us who actually receives the reports.

One week's forecast

The report for 27 February–5 March 2026 lists a boycott campaign involving the drugmaker Teva in Madrid. It also lists a Melbourne entry that names Students for Palestine groups and Free Palestine Melbourne as the accounts posting about it. Its page 4 sets out the rating criteria; potential press coverage is one of them.

The full index

All listings are searchable on the site, each linked to its original. The collection has 2,336 rows; setting aside an overlapping edition of the October anniversary report leaves the 2,259 counted above. Listings dated in the future are forecasts of planned events. Who runs it, and who repeats its alerts

The only J-SOC money in the records, and the accounts that passed its alerts on.

The company running the command post

Ministry order 4502542354 is with Lotan Group International. In the Q4 2025 disclosure its description is “operating the Mashlat”, the Ministry’s name for the command post. The order is worth ILS 151,162.72, and ILS 122,861.01 had been invoiced by Q1 2026. These figures come from our earlier copy of the Ministry’s spreadsheet; they show what was invoiced, not a confirmed cash payment.

The team

In November 2024, Shlomit Hammer told a Knesset committee that she manages the monitoring centre. In January 2025, Hadas Maimon described its reports going to security bodies, ministries and partners.

Who repeated its alerts

Jewish Onliner linked a J-SOC alert about Australia’s 24 August 2025 protests, matching the Ministry’s description of the Sydney rally. StopAntisemites passed on a Ministry alert in November 2024. That shows public sharing, not payment or direction.

Related: other ministries' spending

Not J-SOC. Included because it funds public-opinion work abroad.

Two large partnerships approved by committee

A Diaspora Ministry committee approved an ILS 50m framework with Maccabi World Union, with up to ILS 25m from the Ministry. In September a framework with GenTruth was revised to ILS 60m, with the Ministry paying up to ILS 30m. Committee approval is not a signed contract or a payment, and we have seen neither for GenTruth.

Foreign Ministry campaigns in the US

US foreign-agent (FARA) filings show Show Faith by Works declaring USD 2,313,791.50 received and Bridges Partners declaring USD 197,960 paid out in 24 payments. Clock Tower X filed a schedule of seven monthly USD 4.5m advertising entries, USD 31.5m in all; a schedule is a plan, not proof of spending.

Who Bridges paid

The Bridges filing lists D3 Entertainment (USD 75,000), Rolop LLC (USD 55,260), Roland Samuel Lopez (USD 26,000), Candor Marketing (USD 11,000), Pinkston Group (USD 8,200), Matt Brown Group (USD 8,000), Jon Groves (USD 8,000), Wholehearted Love (USD 4,500) and Mark Forrester (USD 2,000). These are the payee names on the filing; they may not be the people who made the content.

Where this goes next

What politicians have asked, what's still missing, and how to check our work.

Questions in Rome and Brussels

On 25 September 2025, Italian Senator Giuseppe De Cristofaro (question 4-02415) and MEP Mimmo Lucano (E-003735/2025) formally raised concerns about J-SOC. The European Commission replied on 13 November in general terms about rights and foreign interference. It did not confirm the monitoring or say that anyone broke the law.

What we still don't know

We haven't found the command post's contract terms or any renewal, the company behind its technology, who receives its reports, or what happens after a high rating. A gap in the record isn't evidence of a hidden deal, and neither is a shared name.

Check it yourself

Everything here traces to a source code shared with the full report, and every forecast listing links to the Ministry's original.
